

Trail/Bike Path Segment is Fully Closed along North Fork Coyote Creek

Interstate 5 South Corridor Improvement Projects

Santa Fe Springs and Norwalk – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has fully closed a portion of a trail, or bike path, along North Fork Coyote Creek adjacent to the Santa Ana Freeway (I-5) at Alondra Boulevard. Several gates along the path are closed and signed. Signs marking a suggested detour route are posted on Rosecrans Avenue, Carmenita Road, Alondra Boulevard and Marquardt Avenue. (marked detour map is attached)



The path's partial full closure is in effect for approximately one year, until approximately mid-2013. The trail is within the limits of the I-5 HOV Widening and Alondra Boulevard Bridge Project, a \$110 million project to construct one carpool lane and one general purpose lane in both directions from North Fork Coyote Creek Bridge to Marquardt Avenue, reconstruct overcrossings at Alondra Boulevard and North Fork Coyote Creek, and realign and upgrade adjacent frontage roads. The contractor for this project is C.C. Myers, Inc. of Anaheim, Ca. The project is scheduled to complete in mid-2015.
